

4. New Chairman of UGC

Well-known academician and scholar **Prof. Arun Nigavekar** has assumed the charge of the post of Chairman, University Grants Commission, New Delhi. Before assuming this coveted position, he was Vice-Chairman of UGC. He was the founder Director of NAAC, Bangalore and also served as Vice-Chancellor of University of Pune. Prof. Nigavekar is a Physicist with specialization in Material Science. He has rich academic and research experience spanning over three decades with a number of publications in the national and international journals, he has substantial contribution in the field of science education, distance education and educational media. Among the several notable awards he has won are the FIE Foundation Award 1996, UGC National Lecture Award, 1984, ASPEN honor 1993, Best Teacher Award 1991 and Swami Vivekananda Award (1999).

Prof. Nigavekar, has been associated with INFUBNET for a long time and also was a member of INFUBNET Governing Board to support the activities of the Centre.

5. New Vice Chairman For UGC

Prof. V. N. Rajasekharan Pillai is appointed as the new Vice-Chairman of University Grants Commission during March 2003. He has been the Director of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore since April, 2001. Prior to that he was the Vice-Chancellor of the Mahatma Gandhi University, Kerala and has 31 years of teaching, research, research guidance and administrative experience.

He has held post-doctoral and visiting research positions in the Universities of Tubingen, Mainz and Lausanne. He is leading an internationally renowned research group in the area of biopolymers, particularly peptides. He has published extensively (about 200 refereed research publications in international journals) in this area and has guided over 40 doctoral research students. He is an elected Fellow of the Indian Academy of Sciences and an Honorary Senior Fellow of the Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Advanced Scientific Research, Bangalore. He is the recipient of Materials Research Society of India Lecture Award (1997) and Swadeshishastra Puraskar (1998). Under his leadership the NAAC has formulated an action plan for quality evaluation, sustenance and quality upgradation for the higher education institutions in the country, which has been accepted, and being implemented by all the State Governments. He was a member of the working group, which prepared the 10th Plan vision - documents for higher education. He has been interested in activities of INFUBNET since its inception and identified library automation progress as a main point for NAAC accreditation process.

6. New Chairman for INFLIBNET Governing Board

The well-known R&D specialist in Information Technology, Dr S Ramani is appointed as the new Chairman for INFUBNET Governing Board. Dr. S Ramani has the Master of Technology and Ph.D. degrees from Indian Institute of Technology, Bombay. He worked as a Post-doctoral Research Associate at Carnegie-Mellon University, Pittsburgh, USA, during 1971-73. He served as the first Director of the National Centre for Software Technology, Mumbai.

Dr Ramani played a major role in planning and creating ERNET and managed the Domain Registration Service in India for over ten years. He played the key technical role in planning and specifying the VSAT for Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE), education in software technology at NCST, Mumbai. He was the Executive Vice President, ICCC, Member of the Scientific Advisory Committee to the Cabinet in India, National Technical Advisor to the Sustainable Network project, President of Computer Society of India, President, South East Asia Regional Computer Confederation, IFIP Trustee, Editor-in-Chief of Journal of Information Technology for Development, Chairman of the Board of Directors, Commonwealth Network of Information Technology for Development, Board of Directors of ECIL and CMC Ltd. He has served as a Consultant to international organizations such as the UN, UNDP and the World Bank.

7. International Caliber-2003 Report

The 10th National Convention of INFUBNET Centre, CALIBER – 2003 was converted into an International Event and was successfully organized in collaboration with Nirma Education and Research Foundation, Ahmedabad during 13 - 15th February, 2003. The theme of CALIBER – 2003 was "Mapping Technology on Libraries and People". Total of 316 delegates participated in this convention, which included delegates from USA, Philippines, UK, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh apart from Indian delegates. There was an overwhelming response to the call for papers. Authors from different countries contributed and presented papers during the convention. In the proceeding of CALIBER-2003, 67 full text papers and 39 abstracts have been published. About 100 delegates registered for two pre-conference tutorials on Designing and Implementation of Local Area Network and Developing Digital Collection. Prof. B.H. Jajoo, Computer & Information Systems Group, Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad and Dr. Jagadish Arora, Librarian, Indian Institute of Technology, Mumbai were the resource persons for these tutorials, respectively.

The conference was inaugurated by **Shri Narendra Modi**, the Honorable Chief Minister of Gujarat State. Shri Modi in his address emphasized that the knowledge must spread and Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) issues should not come in the way of knowledge dissemination. Dr. Karsanbhai Patel, Chairman, NERF released the souvenir and CD of CALIBER proceedings. Dr. T A V Murthy, Director, INFUBNET Centre highlighted the activities & plans of INFUBNET for promoting IT culture in academic sector and transforming Indian academic libraries. He also informed about UGC-Infonet programme, which is coming up in a big way. Under the programme, INFUBNET will subscribe to core journals in electronic form and make them accessible to academic community in India. Dr. Dilip Kumar Basu, Vice-Chancellor, Tripura University delivered the

keynote address. Dr. S. Ramani, Chairman, Governing Board of INFUBN€T, in his opening remarks, highlighted the role of private institutions and trusts, who would play a vital role in making the education truly global one. Dr A K Singh, Director, NIM welcomed the delegates earlier and Shri Anil Kumar, Organising Secretary, CALIBER-2003 proposed the vote of thanks.

Total deliberations of the CALIBER-2003 were divided in to four technical sessions under sub themes: Library Automation, User Studies, Consortia, and Telecommunications. Sh. A R Sethi of Punjab University and Prof. K C Sahoo of Hari Singh Gaur University, chaired the first session held parallel. Prof I V Malhan of Jammu University, Dr R B Gaddagimath of Gulbarga University, and Prof. I K Ravichandra Rao chaired the other sessions. Dr P K Jaiswal of Mizoram University acted as the Rapporteur General of the conference and he was assisted by many other professionals.

CALIBER 2003 brought out few new things like, **CALIBER – 2003 Updates**, a daily conference newsletter covering the daily events, report of technical sessions and interviews of experts were brought out and circulated to the delegates. In addition to the printed copy of the proceedings, delegates have been given the CD of the proceeding.

Shri. P. Pannervel (IAS), Municipal Commissioner, Ahmedabad was Chief Guest for valedictory function. He underlined the importance of right information at the right time and he said that information technology is changing significantly the way the society was conducting. There is a need for partnership between the industry and the society for overall benefits. Prof. Girish Agrawal, Director, Physical Research Laboratory, Ahmedabad was the guest of honour for this function and highlighted the changing role of librarians in electronic environment. Dr. P.K. Jayaswal, Rapporteur General presented the report on the technical sessions and read out on the recommendations made for consideration to UGC, INFUBNET and university libraries. The Director, INFUBNET, presented the foreign delegates from Sri Lanka and Philippines with mementos. The valedictory function concluded with vote of thanks by Shri Anil Kumar, Organising Secretary of CALIBER-2003.

Around 20 companies from the fields of electronic and online information vendors, books publishers, sellers and subscription agencies displayed their products in the Exhibition arranged at the CALIBER venue. A cultural programme with a flavor of Gujarat folk dances was put up by Mudra Institute of Performing Arts, Ahmedabad after the inaugural function.

Recommendations and Resolutions

Summary of the Resolutions adopted at CALIBER 2003

I. UGC

- 1. It is strongly recommended that, support to university libraries be continued to develop and maintain IT infrastructure in the university therein.
- 2. The CDC of Library and Information Science is advised to incorporate the latest IT based services initiated by INFUBNET with suitable hands-on training.
- 3. It also recommended that NAAC Committee be advised to take suitable steps in evaluation of the academic system in universities and colleges giving due weightage to the library automation with involvement of library professionals.
- 4. In view of the above initiatives the institutions and universities be strengthened with the professionally qualified librarians to successfully implement UGC-Infonet.
- 5. INFUBNET may further be strengthened with required manpower to implement, monitor and execute the UGC-Infonet, e-subscription, e-learning, IT literacy training programmes across the country.

II INFLIBNET

- 1. **INFUBNET** to decentralize its activities on regional basis in the areas of training, support services of SOUL and implementation and coordination of UGC-Infonet programme.
- 2. INFUBNET should strengthen the SOUL software to take care of all the university/college library requirements and modify accordingly. Further it was suggested to rename the SOUL software in view of its wider acceptability in different environments.
- 3. Design and develop new programmes for the library and information professionals taking into account the new initiative taken up by UGC.
- 4. Attention to be paid to develop regional language database and e-learning modules, and be a partner in the content creation activities in the country.
- 5. INFUBNET should initiate work towards digitization of potential resources generated by the universities such as Doctoral dissertations, working papers, reports, seminar proceedings and other useful materials.
- 6. **INFUBNET** should draw on the expertise available with the university libraries for programme implementation.

III University Libraries

- 1. Participating libraries must implement the programmes and policies of INFLIBN∈T and contribute data from time to time and ensure quality of service.
- 2. Participating libraries should make judicious use of the resources and facilities that are provided under the UGC-Infonet Programme.

8. Union Databases - Update

Development of union database is one of the important activities of the centre. These databases can be accessed online using Internet through INFUBNET web page at URL http://www.inflibnet.ac.in

- Books Database: Received around 60 Lakh records from 89 universities and has more than 12 lakh unique records processed from 52 universities and remaining are under process. These records represent holdings of participant libraries under the programme covering both old as well as current books.
- Theses: Has more than 1.4 lakh records of doctoral theses submitted to various Indian universities till date. Efforts are in progress to include abstracts in this database.
- Serials Holdings Database: It has more than 13,751 unique serial titles having over 47,000 holdings of various universities in the country.
- Current Serials Database: Current serials database is created to provide access to journals
 currently subscribed by the university libraries.
- Experts Database: Provides useful data relating to the name(s) of the experts in different disciplines. This database has more than 13000 records, and is growing steadily.
- Research Projects: Has over 9000 records and nearly 1000 records are under process.
- NISSAT Project Database has more than 20000 experts profiles in the area of Science and Technology and is provided access on the web http://nissat.inflibnet.ac.in

All these databases are updated on regular basis.

9. Human Resource Development

a. IRTPLA reports

INFUBNET Regional Training Programme for Library Automation (IRTPLA), the series of training programmes started by INFUBNET, was arranged for the following states during April-2002 to March 31, 2003

Gujarat

Second IRTPLA programme for Gujarat State was held at Saurashtra University during 14 – 18 May, 2002 in conjunction with Refresher Course held by Academic Staff College, Saurashtra University. Dr. Maheshchandra Yagnik, Pro-Vice Chancellor inaugurated the programme. Total 29 participants attended the programme from various colleges in Gujarat. In the concluding session Shri S M Slagar, Scientist-G, INFUBNET and Dr Maheshchandra Yagnik distributed the certificates.

Dr. T A V Murthy, Director INFUBNET attended the special valedictory function held on June 1 and addressed the participants. Dr. K G Mavani, Vice Chancellor, Dr. Bhadrayu Vachharajani, Director of ASC, Shri Kaladhar Arya, Asst. Director of ASC and Shri H G Hosamani, Scientist-B of INFUBNET were also present on the occasion.

Himachal Pradesh and Chandigarh

IRTPLA for Himachal Pradesh and Chandigarh was held at Dr Y S Parmar University of Horticulture & Forestry, Solan during 25-29 June, 2002. Programme was inaugurated by Prof. S S Negi, Vice-Chancellor of the University. He told that the information explosion due to increased R&D activities and changes in technologies are posing challenges to the information managers for managing information in LI Centres. He appreciated the steps taken by INFUBN€T to train the Librarians and for selecting a University out side UGC set-up. Shri J K Vijayakumar, Scientific Technical Officer, INFUBN€T described about IRTPLA and other HRD activities of the Centre. Dr. S D Sharma, Librarian (I/C) welcomed the gathering and Dr. M S Pathania, IRTPLA Co-ordinator proposed the vote of thanks. Total 19 participants attended the programme and sufficient time was given to practice on SOUL.

At concluding session, Dr. Jagmohan Singh Chauhan, Director of Extension Education and Dean of College of Horticulture was the Chief Guest and addressed the participants by highlighting INFUBNET's future course of action and facilities required for development of University and College Libraries and distributed Certificates to the participants. Dr. M S Pathania and Shri Sushant Banerjee (BL, Chandigarh) acted as the resource persons along with Shri J K Vijayakumar and Shri Umesha from INFUBNET.

b. INFLIBNET - ICSSR -Workshop

This workshop was sponsored by Indian Council for Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi and the Netherland Foundation for the Advancement of Tropical Research (WOTRO), The Hague. Subject Gateways, Virtual Libraries, Directories, Mailing Lists, Search Engines etc, dealing with Social Science and allied subjects.

Each participant was provided with one PC with Internet connectivity to have hands on experience. This workshop created lot of excitement among the participants and they looked very satisfied at the end of the workshop, which they candidly expressed during the feedback session. The concluding session of the same was held on 3rd May, 2002 and Dr. T A V Murthy, Director INFUBNET graced it and distributed certificates to the participants. सूचना एवं पुस्तकालय नेटवर्क केन्द्र, द्वारा पहली बार ग्रंथालय कर्मियों (प्रोफेशनल्स) की स्थानीय भाषा में प्रशिक्षण की आवश्यकता को दृष्टिगत रखते हुए ग्रंथालय स्वचालन के प्रभावी क्रियान्चयन हेतु प्रशिक्षण कार्यक्रम राष्ट्रीय स्तर पर हिन्दी माध्यम में आयोजित किया । यह ग्रंथालयों में स्वचालन एवं नेटवर्किंग के क्रियान्चयन हेतु आवश्यक सैद्धांतिक एवं प्रायोगिक पक्षों से संबंधित पाँच दिवसीय प्रशिक्षण कार्यक्रम था । भारत में अपनी तरह की हिन्दी माध्यम में राष्ट्रीय स्तर की स्वचालन एवं नेटवर्क के क्षेत्र में यह पहली कार्यशाला आयोजित की गई । इस कार्यशाला में १६ अभ्यार्थियों ने भाग लिया एवं अत्याधुनिक आवश्यक उपकरणों से सुसज्जित एवं तीव्रगतियुक्त इंटरनेट सुसज्जित कम्प्यूटर कार्यशाला एवं विषय विशेषज्ञ वैज्ञानिक कर्मियों से तकनीकी विषयो को सीखने समझने जानने का अवसर प्राप्त किया । इनको सुबह से शाम तक सैद्धान्तिक पक्ष के साथ-साथ कम्प्यूटर पर प्रयोगात्मक पक्ष का लाभ भी दिया गया । हिन्दी माध्यम से ही विभिन्न पक्षों पर अध्ययन सामग्री उपलब्ध कराई गई ।

इसका विधिवत उद्घाटन दिनांक ९ दिसम्बर २००२ अंतरिक्ष उपयोग केन्द्र, अहमदाबाद के पुस्तकालयाध्यक्ष श्री आर.एस. शर्मा के कर कमलो द्वारा सम्पन्न हुआ । अपने उद्घाटन भाषण में श्री शर्मा ने शैक्षणिक एवं अनुसंधान ग्रन्थालयों में स्वचालन एवं नेटवर्क के महत्व के आज की आवश्यकता बताया । कार्यक्रम की अध्यक्षता इन्फलिबनेट केन्द्र के निदेशक डॉ. टी.ए.वी. मूर्ति ने की ।

e. In-house Lecture Series

Monthly in-house lectures are being successfully conducted at the Centre to share the knowledge and skills among the staff. Under this series, lectures are delivered by a staff member on a particular topic of his / her area of work which in turn enriches the knowledge of others in that area. During this period a lecture was delivered by Dr. Kaiser Nikham, Reader & Management Consultant University of Mysore. She delivered lecture on Metadata Foundations, Potentialities and Applications. The lecture focused on Metadata architecture, standards, applications languages resource description Framework, Registries and metadata future etc.

Shri S K Sharma, Scientist-B (Computer Science) INFUBNET delivered a lecture on "Information Security Management ISO 17799/BS 7799 Standard". This is a generic standard for information security to protect the data or information from virus, computer hacking, fraud, theft and corruption of information. The Inhouse lecture attracted lot of discussion among the staff.

10. UGC – Infonet Report

Keeping in view the vision of Dr. Arun Nigavekar, University Grants Commission, has launched an ambitious programme to bring about a qualitative change in the academic infrastructure, especially for higher education. Under this initiative, UGC is modernizing the University Campuses with State-of-the-art campus wide networks and setting up its own nationwide communication network named UGC-Infonet. In this connection, the technical challenges of the Centre have been galvanized and focused to co-ordinate with 170 universities across the country by signing the MOU's and co-ordinate with ERNET for expediting the survey, issuing of Performa invoices and getting the money released by UGC. Training of the manpower to manage the electronic Subscriptions and to take care of the operational aspects of the systems is also INFUBNET's responsibility. The centre is committed to translate the vision of the Hon'ble Chairman into reality by making strenuous efforts and will continue to meet the deadlines.

a. First Training Programme on UGC - INFONET

Trained manpower is one of the most critical resources for successful implementation of high-tech programmes like UGC-Infonet. Under this programme, INFUBNET and ERNET India organized the first training programme on "Basics of Networking, UGC-InfoNet and its management" during 16 - 21 December, 2002 at ERNET India, New Delhi. Shri Meharban Singh, Senior manager, ERNET India welcomed the participants and delegates. Dr. T A V Murthy, Director, INFUBNET inaugurated the workshop. Dr. Gulshan Rai, Executive Director, ERNET India spoke on the occassion about the training programme and the facility available at ERNET Lab. Dr. Surender Pal, Director of ERNET India briefed about course contents. 2nd Training Programme on UGC Infonet held was during February 24 – March 1, 2003 at ERNET India, New Delhi. 14 participants attended this programme from selected universities. Shri Meharban Singh, Senior Manager, ERNET India and Shri S K Sharma, Scientist –B, INFUBNET Centre were the course coordinators. 3rd Course on Basics of Networking UGC-InfoNet and its Management was held from 24th February- 1st March, 2003. Shri S K Sharma, Scientist-B of INFUBNET and Shri Meharban Singh, Senior Manager of ERNET India acted as the course coordinators.

11. E-subscription Initiatives

a. Initiatives

The priority set by Prof. Arun Nigavekar, Chairmen UGC for the Academic and research community on E-subscription took momentum during this period. Hectic efforts have been continued to identify the core journals for subscription. To address this major issue in E-subscription 7 special meetings were convened by Dr. TAV Murthy at different places across the country. These meetings were arranged at different regions to save the expenditure and also for the convenience of the librarians to attend the meetings within the short notification. Around 70 librarians were called to understand the requirements of the journal titles. The comprehensive list of journal was prepared and sent in Advance. These meetings were helpful to inform the professionals

about the E-Journals Subscription Initiative and its benefits. There was overwhelming response from the university librarians who appreciated the effort of UGC INFUBNET for providing effective access to scholarly literature as the universities are facing lot of difficulty in subscribing to important costly publications.

In order to subscribe scholarly journals and databases, a committee was setup by chairman, UGC. Background work was done relating to identifying different database and full text journals in the initial stage. Several meetings of committees and sub committees were held to find out the sources, viz abstracting and indexing titles, full text databases and gateway portals and communicated to different vendors, societies for their proposals.

Initially four subject viz. physics, chemistry, and mathematics, biological sciences have been identified.

For chemistry, access to chemical abstracts, full text access to journals from American chemical society, Royal society of chemistry will be provided. For Physics access to INSPEC, ADS, access to full text journals from Institute of Physics, American Institute of Physics, American Physical Society will be provided. For Mathematics access to mathematical reviews and for Biological sciences access to BIOSIS previews will be provided. Apart from this, access to nature journal for 50 proposed universities. The Cambridge University Press journals having titles in Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Biology, Environmental Sciences have also been considered for subscription under the E-journal Subscription.

The universities across the country will also be provided with access to journal contents pages along with abstract for more than 9000 journals in field of Science and Technologies, Humanities and Social Sciences through gate way portal access. These gate way portals will also provide customized services by providing access to individual library collection as well as link to full text journals subscribed under the UGC Infonet Subscription.

In order to provide archival access to the journals in the area of social sciences and humanities and also few science titles, initiative has been taken to provide access to Jstore collection, which is not for profit making organizations. Efforts are also being made to subscribe full text journals from commercial publishers viz. Elsevier, Kluwer, Springer- Verlag, Blackwell, Taylor & Francis etc. However these journals may be subscribed in parts, based on the journal requirement received from different universities.

The entire exercise on e-subscription has made very valid recommendations to the Chairman of the UGC for placing orders based on the merits of the academician needs and librarians' point of view. The recommendations are being referred to GB for further necessary action.

E-Subscription Regional Meetings Report

The priority set by Prof. Arun Nigavekar, Chairman UGC for the Academic and Research Community on E-subscription took momentum during this period. The initiative took lot of interactions among the professionals during the CALIBER-2003 and it was recommended to get feedbacks from university librarians.

One of the major issues in e-subscription is relating to selection of core list of electronic journals and databases in all the major disciplines. In this direction special meetings were convened by Dr. T A V Murthy, Director INFUBNET at seven different places covering the entire country. This meeting was called at different regions to save the expenditure and also the convenience of the

librarians to attend the meeting within the short duration. Around 70 librarians were called to understand the requirement of journal titles. The comprehensive list of journals prepared at the centre was sent to around 70 libraries to get the list of useful titles.

The first meeting was held at Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar on 3rd March, 2003. Dr. Sukhbir Singh was the local coordinator for conducting this meeting. 13 librarians were invited and 9 of them could attend. Dr. T A V Murthy briefed about the e-subscription initiative of UGC-INFUBNET. All the librarians appreciated the effort of UGC in providing effective access to scholarly literature as the universities are facing lot of difficulty in subscribing to important costly publications. The meeting was fruitful to understand the important issues relating to e-subscription with the participation from other invited professors also.

The second meeting was neld at University of Madras, Chennai on 4th March, 2003 for the state of Tamilnadu, Kerala and Pondicherry. Dr. R Vengan University Librarian was the local coordinator for the meeting. Sh. S M Salgar, Scientist – G briefed about the important activity of UGC-Infonet and Sh. V S Cholin, Scientist –B, presented the e-subscription initiative of UGC-INFUBNET. Lot of interaction took place among the members who attended the meeting. Sh. Salgar and Cholin could clarify many of the issues relating to these matters. Rev Fr. Dr. S. Ignacimuthu, Vice Chancellor, University of Madras also met the members and appreciated the effort of INFUBNET – UGC in providing e-access to scholarly literature. 8 librarians in that region attended the meeting out of 11 called.

The third meeting for the state of Andhra Pradesh, Orissa and Chattisgarh was held on 5th March, 2003 at Andhra University, Visakhapatnam. Prof. R S R Varalakshmi, Head, Department of Library and Information Science coordinated the meeting. Sh. S M Salgar highlighted the important initiative of UGC-INFUBNET and then clarified many issues. Sh. V S Cholin made presentation on the e-subscription initiatives of INFUBNET. Members attending the meeting appreciated the effort and looked forward for its early implementation for the benefit of research and academic community. 8 librarians could attend the meeting.

The fourth meeting was held for the state of UP, Bihar and Jharkhand at B R Ambedkar Agra University, Agra on 6th Mach, 2003. 10 out of 11 librarians called attended the meeting and had useful discussion. Dr. T A V Murthy highlighted the important activities initiated by UGC through INFUBNET and role of INFUBNET in these activities. All the members appreciated the idea of providing e-access to scholarly content especially when the UGC-Infonet is going to connect each university to the network. The meeting was coordinated by Prof. S M Tripathi, OSD-Library, Agra University.

The fifth meeting was held at Tripura University, Agartala for the states of North Eastern states and West Bengal on 7th March, 2003. Five members attended the meeting representing the five states in this region. Sh. S M Salgar and Sh. V S Cholin discussed number of issues relating the new initiatives of INFUBNET. Dr. H S Chakravarthy, Dy. Librarian, Tripura University was the coordinator.

The sixth meeting for the states of Gujarat, Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh was held at Ahmedabad on 8th March, 2003. Dr. T A V Murthy highlighted the efforts of the centre and Sh. V S Cholin made presentation on e-subscription initiative. 9 librarians participated in the discussion.

The seventh meeting of Librarians from the states of Karnataka, Maharashtra and Goa on E-Subscription was held at Karnatak University, Dharwad on 22nd March, 2003. Prof. C R Karisiddappa, Head, DLIS, Karnataka University welcomed the librarians and Dr. T A V Murthy, Director of INFUBNET spoke on INFUBNET & UGC initiatives. Shri K Prakash of INFUBNET made a presentation on E-subscriptions efforts made by INFUBNET. Dr. Harish Chandra, Librarian of IIT, Chennai also shared his views and experience on e-subscriptions. Prof. Saidapur, Dean, School of Sciences and Head, Dept of Zoology, Karnatak University also spoke on this occasion and he welcomed the idea. He is expecting the implementation of the same soon.

36 libraries have sent the data relating to their requirements and same was analysed at INFUBNET and was used to select the titles in the first phase. The national negotiation meeting, scheduled to be held on 3rd April, is expected to give more clarity on these issues.

12. Review of DDS – Recon Projects

A meeting was called by the Director, INFUBNET at University of Hyderabad, as a follow up of Governing Board resolution to review the progress made by the six document delivery centres under the DDS project and five libraries under Retrospective conversion project to discuss further course of action. Brief summary of the meeting is given below.

The DDS centres may have qualified person appointed on temporary basis by increasing the stipend to Rs. 5000/- PM for providing the photocopy as well as electronic document delivery service. INFUBNET should write to UGC for enhancing the salary of Xerox operator and suggest suitable nomenclature for the same.

The service should be made popular by publishing the write-up's in major publications. The brochures could also be sent to all heads of the Departments for wide publicity of the service. Committee suggested for including this service in all university home pages.

Collect current and complete holding details from all the libraries and prepare a union database from time to time and host it online and a copy may be made available to the libraries.

The participating libraries will have to respond quickly for the queries and will also acknowledge the request as early as possible (possibly by email)

All the participating libraries will have separate email account on the name of dds@ for DDS and will operate regularly.

Allow individual users to create their account by depositing Rs. 500/-. The expenditure may be deducted from as and when the service is provided to them.

Regarding the Retrocoversion project the progress is not encouraging as there were hurdles in terms of grants, difficulty in getting trained manpower etc. Not much has been done by these libraries except a good progress from University of Madras and University of Mumbai.

INFLIBNET will explore the possibility of getting the LC subject headings in CD form.

Staff from INFUBN€T will visit these libraries and discuss the problems faced in data conversion work.

Catalogue module of SOUL software may be supplied to remaining universities if the request comes from these libraries for the data conversion work.

Proper action plan is to be prepared by all the five libraries for the next installment grant and adhere to their commitments.

Each university will send the records created by them under the subject assigned for merging the data after incorporating the suggestions provided by INFLIBNET for data conversion.

Libraries will create records only for the subjects assigned now and will check for their quality before sending them to INFLIBNET.

13. Creation of Indian Bibliographic Databases - Initiative

A meeting was also called by the Director, INFUBNET in order to initiate and improve access to Indian resources published by creating the bibliographical databases with holding details. Most libraries, museums, archives, learned societies in the country have rich collection of published and unpublished resources in Indian languages. These resources represent unique contributions of Indian scholars in different fields of studies reflecting Indian culture, arts, music, religion, philosophy, politics, science, medicine etc. There is a great need than ever to capture this information and create databases in electronic form and provide an easy access to the same through World Wide Web. He highlighted importance of Indian scholars' contribution and to bring it to global access. He also highlighted the initiatives taken by INFUBNET in different areas.

Dr. L S Ramaiah has compiled number of bibliographic tools viz. Tribal Linguistics in India, Indian English – A bibliographic guide etc. Dr. Ramaiah said that there is no bibliographic control. He opined that, somewhere it has to begin and INFUBNET should make a beginning in compiling and establishing the bibliographic control.

Prof. A Y Asundi, appreciated the idea of creation of Indian publications database especially of reference works in Indian Languages. He opined that, 20-30 % of the world wide digital library projects are on the Reference works collection. Prof. Asundi has also compiled an annotated bibliography of Kannada resources. There are number of studies by different researchers in different states on the reference collection in their languages (viz. Kannada, Oriya, Gujarati, Marathi etc).

Sh. Manibhai Prajapati gave the statistics of Manuscripts availability. The project could consider the subject wise manuscripts creation along with period. Foreigner's contributions to Indology is another area. He highlighted the importance of location of an item in the database, as mere compilation does not help, its availability is equally important. The database will have the holding details for these items.

Dr. Abbas Khan of Maulana Azad National Urdu University, Dr. A R Sethi of Panjab University, Dr. Kognurmath of Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Dr. Krishan Gopal of JNU, Dr. R Vengan of University of Madras, Shri E Rama Reddy of University of Hyderabad, Prof. V P Rajahansa of University of Mumbai and Shri B N Singh of Banaras Hindu University expressed their opinions on the subject.

General observations on the project

The country has potential output from the Indian scholars which is yet to reach many. It could be fruitful exercise and INFUBNET should make a beginning by taking the help of few retired professors and also identify the work done by different people.

It was decided to have a small committee to come out with the proposal to be submitted to UGC and start on experimental basis and host Indian information on the web through INFUBNET.

Dr. T A V Murthy suggested the name of Dr. L S Ramaiah as the chairman of the committee and other members will be included later.

14. Soul News

SOUL – the software developed by iNFUBN€T, is attracting more number of libraries and during the period following activities were held.

a. SOUL Familiarisation programmes

Dr. T S Kumbar, Shri Yatrik Patel and Shri Ashok Achtani of INFUBNET visited Mumbai for a SOUL familiarization programme for college librarians in Mumbai metro. About 90 local librarians participated and SOUL demo CDs were distributed to the participants during the programme.

Shri Ashok Achtani, Section Officer and Shri Umesha, STA-II visited Sarvajanik College of Engineering and Technology, Surat for demonstrating the software to 12 librarians and distributed the Demo CDS.

SOUL Familiarization Programme for College Librarians in Kolkatta was arranged at University of Calcutta on 27 July, 2002. Dr. T A V Murthy, Shri Yatrik Patel and Shri Ashok Achtani attended the programme. About 170 Local Librarians participated and SOUL demo CDs were distributed to the participants.

SOUL Familiarization Programme for College Librarians in Chennai was arranged at University of Chennai on 24 August, 2002. Dr. T A V Murthy, Shri B Ramesh and Shri Ashok Achtani of INFUBNET attended the programme. About 125 Local Librarians participated and SOUL demo CDs were distributed to the participants.

Shri Ashok Achtani and Shri Umesha of INFUBNET visited State Institute of Health Family Welfare, Ahmedabad, (Gujarat State) for demonstrating SOUL on 10 July, 2002.

Shri Yatrik Patel and Shri Ashok Achtani visited Tolani Institute of Management Studies, Adipur, (Gujarat State) for demonstrating the software on 20 July, 2002. About 25 Local Librarians participated and SOUL demo CDs were distributed to the participants.

b. SOUL Orientation Programmes

The third orientation programme for SOUL purchasers was conducted during 24 – 26 June, 2002. 16 participants attended the programme who have purchased the software. Shri B Ramesh, Scientist-B acted as the coordinator for the programme.

The fourth Orientation Programme for SOUL purchasers was conducted during 01 - 03 July, 2002 17 participants attended the programme who have purchased the software.

The Fifth Orientation Programme for SOUL purchasers was conducted during 05 - 09 August, 2002. 10 Participants attended the programme who have purchased the software. Shri B Ramesh, Scientist — B acted as the coordinator for both the programmes.

The sixth, seventh and eighth orientation programmes for SOUL purchasers were conducted at INFUBNET Centre during 17 — 21 February, 24 — 28 February and 3 — 7 March, 2003 respectively. Total 31 participants attended these programmes from the institutes who have newly purchased SOUL Software. Shri Ashok Achtani, Section Officer acted as Coordinator for the three programmes.

c. SOUL coordinating centres

Keeping in a view of the growing demand of SOUL software, a proposal was mooted through our last Governing Board and clearance received from UGC for setting of Regional co-ordinators and service centres at Mumbai, Patiala, Hyderabad, Bangalore and Ahmedabad. Other regions are picking up and coverage will be expanded into different states.

d. SOUL updated version

INFUBNET Centre formally released Software for University Libraries (SOUL) in February, 2000 during CALIBER at Chennai. The popularity of this library management software can be gauged from the fact that in a short span of few years it has been supplied to more than 160 institutions. All software have a few bugs initially, which come out with actual usage, and SOUL is no exception. We also received a large number of suggestions from user libraries to improve some functionalities of SOUL. Though we had been carrying out modifications from time to time, based on specific requests from libraries, it was decided to put concentrated efforts and bring out a new version of SOUL, which will meet demands of most of the academic libraries. After strenuous efforts, INFUBNET came out with a new version of SOUL by the end of February, 2003. After rigorous testing, copies of the new version were sent to 125 user libraries, free of cost, who had bought SOUL earlier. Since in the new version, several database fields and their definitions were changed, a separate utility was developed to help old users to migrate old SOUL database to new one. This utility has also been sent to old users. This conversion is limited to the Catalogue and Circulation modules only. The updated version of SOUL was also supplied to 35 new users of SOUL. INFUBNET is flooded with demands and requests from many more universities, colleges and other institutions for supply of network version as well as college version of SOUL.

e. Training Programme on SOUL at Solan, Himachal Pradesh

Dr Y S Parmar University of Horticulture and Forestry, Nauni (Solan) organized a "Training programme on SOUL for the working librarians of Himachal Pradesh Education Department" during 6-10 January, 2003. Prof. S. S. Negi, Vice Chancellor of the University inaugurated the programme. Dr. S D Sharma, Librarian (I/C), Dr. M S Pathania, Dy Librarian and coordinator, Shri Prem Chand (INFUBNET), and Shri M L N Chary (CIEFL. Hyderabad) also spoke on the occasion. 18 working librarians selected from public and college libraries of Himachal Pradesh attended the programme. Shri Premchand and Shri M L N Chary handled sessions on SOUL and INFUBNET activities.

f. Demonstration of SOUL at IGNOU, New Delhi

Shri B Ramesh, Scientist-B conducted a Demonstration of SOUL Software at Indira Gandhi National Open University, New Delhi on March 04, 2003. IGNOU have decided to provide this software for all its centres across the country for the students to study the same for all the Regional Centres.

15. Marc 21 Based Online Cataloguing Systems

As part of using MARC 21 standard in our SOUL software and INFUBNET Union databases, a review meeting took place at INFUBNET Centre. Efforts made by INFUBNET were placed before the Expert committee, which greatly admired and appreciated the efforts and gave few more suggestions for moving towards the emerging databases at international level with powerful search engines.

16. Nissat Project – Update

Under the DSIR/NISSAT sponsored project on "Developing and Managing a Web Enabled Database of Expert Manpower: Module in the Area of Science and Technology:, INFUBNET Centre has got a mandate to compile and organize profiles of Senior Scientists, Professors, Readers and technologists working in the national laboratories, S & T departments of central and state governments, institutions of national importance, universities and other R & D organizations. At present "Web Enabled Database of Experts in Science and Technology" contains around 20,000 profiles and the same are available at http://nissat.inflibnet.ac.in, we request you to visit the site and register in the database online. Our existing experts are requested to update their profiles and recommend peers for registration. Institutes are requested to check for the inclusion of all their scientists.






